

Continuing Education Credit

Continuing education credit is awarded on a session-by-session basis with full attendance required for session attended. Representatives from The Institute for Continuing Education will be onsite to accept applications for continuing education credit and to assist attendees with questions.

Non-Credit Events:

Continuing education credit is not offered for breakfast/luncheon events, resource fair, or poster sessions.

Session Ranking:

Due to the interdisciplinary nature of this Institute, sessions have not been ranked for skill levels. Attendees are urged to review the session descriptions to determine appropriateness for professional and personal needs.

Continuing education credit is offered as listed:

Child Development Associates: The Institute for Continuing Education recognizes the continuing education criteria and guidelines of the International Association for Continuing Education Training for the awarding of continuing education credit to early childhood education professionals.

Educators: Educators who enter the continuing education system will receive a verification of the contact hours earned at the Dual Language Institute. It is the responsibility of educators to check with their school districts to determine if the Dual Language Institute is acceptable for credit for staff/professional development units.

Certified Family Life Education Professionals: This program has been submitted to the National Council on Family Relations for review/approval of continuing education credit. Head Start Family Service Workers may be interested in earning continuing education credit in this area toward their credentialing.

Social Work: The Institute for Continuing Education is approved as a provider for social work continuing education by the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB) through the Approved Continuing Education (ACE) program, (800-225-6880).
